

Everything in the human body has limits. Eyes can only see for a certain distance. Ears can only hear sound of a certain volume and pitch, and the human mind cannot understand everything.

The מִשְׁנָה says there are four things one should not investigate. We are told that whoever looks into these matters has no respect for the honor of his Creator. In fact, the מִשְׁנָה says if someone investigates these four things...it would have been better for him not to have been born!

- 1) What is above and 2) what is below. This means what is above and below the heads of the חַיּוֹת angels.
- 3) What is before and 4) what is after. That is, what is before the eastern border of the universe and what is beyond the western border.

The Torah says, " פּי שְׁאֵל נָא לְיָמִים רְאשׁנִים אֲשֶׁר הָיוּ " רְאשׁנִים אֲשֶׁר הָיוּ לְפְנֶיךּ לְמִן הַיּוֹם אֲשָׁר בָּרָא אֱלֹקִים אָדָם עַל הָאָרֶץ וּלְמִקְצֵה לְפָנֶיךּ לְמִן הַיּוֹם אֲשָׁר בָּרָא אֱלֹקִים אָדָם עַל הָאָרֶץ וּלְמִקְצֵה הַשְּׁמִיִם וְעַד קְצֵה הַשִּׁמִיִם וְעַד קְצֵה הַשִּׁמִיִם וְעַד קְצֵה הַשִּׁמִיִם וּשׁר " When you ask now about the first days that were before you, from the day when Hashem created Man on the earth and from one edge of the heaven and until the edge of haven" (דברים ד,לב, Deut. 4,32).

We see from here we are supposed to ask only of "the first days," not about what is before the creation of the universe.





## Measure-of-a-nipp

A מְקְנֶה is a ritual bath used to purify people and utensils. When the Torah commands someone who is טָמֵא (impure) to purify himself in the מִקְנֶה, it says he must wash himself "in the water." "The" water means that מִקְנֶה water is different from an ordinary pool of water. A מְקְנֶה 's waters must be gathered naturally, for example, from rain runoff.

A מְקְנֶה must contain at least forty סְאָה of water (about 76 gallons, or 328 liters). How do we know that this much water is needed?

The Torah states that a טָמֵא person must wash "all his flesh" in the מִקְנֶה waters. We see that the מְקְנֶה must be big enough to contain "all his flesh," that is, his entire body. A human body is, basically speaking, one אַמָּה (cubit) wide, by one אַמָּה thick by three אַמָּה tall (an אַמָּה is about 21.25 inches or 54 centimeters). This means the human body contains three cubic אַמוֹת of water.

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
