# DAF YOMI<sup>4</sup> KIDS


## Inside The Daf

In the **בית המקדש** (Holy Temple), daybreak was very important. The **קרבנות** (offerings) could only be offered from daybreak. Daybreak is when the first light appears over the the eastern horizon.

The **משנה** describes how **כהנים** would check to see if it was daybreak. An announcer would climb up the wall or go on to the roof, and when he saw daybreak would call out, "**ברקאי!**", which means "**light!**"

**משנה** says it is not enough to see a little light. Rather the announcer must say "the entire eastern sky has lit up" even until the eastern city of **חברון**.

The **משנה** asks why this procedure was done. Couldn't everyone see when daybreak was? The answer is that once the light of the moon was so bright they thought it was daybreak. As a result, the **קרבן תמיד** (daily offering) was slaughtered at night making it **פסול** (invalid).

"And even in Egypt," Mr. Samberg added, "when Torah study was near impossible because of the Egyptian slave drivers, Jews still made a point to study Torah."


Matty thought about this for a moment and decided, "You know, Dad, maybe I do have enough energy...for at least a little review."

# Always Learning



It is important to know that as long as there were Jewish people there were always schools for Torah study.

ישיבות said: from the days of our forefathers there were always ישיבות (Torah study centers), even in Egypt and in the desert! Our forefathers אַבְרָהָם, יַעֲקֹב and יִצְחָק were each elder Torah scholars who studied in ישיבות.

Even אַבְרָהָם's servant, אֱלִיעֶזֶר was an elder Torah scholar who studied in a ישיבה. אֱלִיעֶזֶר says that אֱלִיעֶזֶר was such a good student of אַבְרָהָם that that he was a "master" over all that אַבְרָהָם taught him.

In fact, אֱלִיעֶזֶר was called דַּמְשֵׁק אֱלִיעֶזֶר, "The Damascene אֱלִיעֶזֶר." אֱלִיעֶזֶר says that this name is an acronym for, "דוֹלָה וּמְשִׁיקָה מִתּוֹרַתּוֹ שֶׁל רַבּוֹ," meaning "he drew from his teacher's teachings and gave it to others to drink."
