




## Inside the Daf

Have you ever been stared at? It probably was not a pleasant experience.

A פֿתֵן who has blemishes may not bless the Jewish people with the בַּרְכַּת כּהֲנִים (Priestly Blessing). This is because when he goes in front of the people to bless them they will stare at his blemish. This can cause the blemish. This can cause the בֹתַנְים to become distracted. Also, the בְּתַנְים teaches that one who stares at the בֹתַנִים

while they perform the בַּרְכַּת כֹּחֲנִים will become blind. The Talmud lists the blemishes that a מָקן may not have.

### A מדות Moment


"So we see how important it is to avoid fights," said Robbie. "And to share the wealth."

### Did You Know..

One may not read the Torah to the congregation or be a prayer leader while one's legs are uncovered (for example, while wearing shorts). It is considered disrespectful to the Torah's honor and insulting to the congregation.



# The-Ways-of-Heretics



One may not lead the prayers if he refuses to while wearing sandals or colored clothing

In the times of the Second בית הַמִּקְדָּשׁ (Holy Temple), idolaters and heretics abounded. Idol worshippers of the time were careful not to wear colored clothing or sandals during their prayer services.

The מִשְׁנָה teaches that if someone says, "I will not be a prayer leader in colored clothing," we do not allow him to be a prayer leader at all, even in white clothing. Also, if he says, "I will not be a prayer leader in sandals," we do not allow him to lead the prayers even barefoot. In both of

these cases, we suspect this person to be an idolater. Since he is an idolater he may not lead the prayer services no matter what he is wearing.

The מִּשְׁנָה also teaches that it is **heresy\*** to wear head הְפָלִץ (phylacteries) on the forehead instead of on top of the head, or to wear arm הְפָלִץ on the palm of the hand instead of on the bicep.

#### Heresy (heh • reh • see).

An action or belief against the Jewish faith. The Sadducees (צְדוֹקִים) of the Second Temple era were heretics and did not accept the Oral Torah.
