Sometimes, work is allowed on חוֹל הַמּוֹעֵד only if it is a מַעֲשֵׁה הֶדְיוֹט, work that a non-professional can do. For example, fish traps may be made on nic since it is a simple task to make such nets and does not require a professional. On the other hand, bird nets may not be made because they require a professional to make. Professional work is called "מַעֵשֵׁה אוּמָן".

A אַשָּׁה אוּפָן is allowed to make a utensil that makes food fit to eat. For example, רְב יְהוּדָה ruled that אַמִי the Oven Maker could build a new oven on אַמִי the Oven Maker could build a new oven on חול הַמוֹעָד since an oven makes food fit to eat. Even so, bird nets may not be made because they do not *make* food fit for eating, but rather *trap* food. Therefore, they may be made only by a מַעַשָּׁה הָדִיוֹט .

Did You Know...

אָדָא, the Fisherman gave advice to אַדָּא healthy ways to eat fish. Some of his "recipes" included broiling fish in salt, place it in water and dip it in fish broth. This should be accompanied by a a drink of water.

Mourner's Work

We have discussed the rules for working and not working on חול but there is a sadder time when working is not allowed, when one is a mourner.

A mourner may not work for seven days after the death of a close relative. This means he may not work at an olive press during this time.

After olives are picked, they are put in a large tub to soften. Once they've softened, they are turned over and put inside an olive press to be crushed. Once they are turned over, they need to be pressed right away or they will spoil.

What happens if someone has turned his olives over and then finds out a close relative has died? If he doesn't finish pressing the olives, they will spoil and he will lose money. אין רְבָּן גְמְלִיאֵל says if there is no one who knows how to press olives except for the mourner, he may press them in private so that he does not lose his money.
