

How do we know a סוּכָּה must be at least 10 טְפָחים high (about 3 ft , or 1 m)?
We know that סוּפּכוֹת must have walls and according to the Talmud, a wall less than 10 טְים is not a true "wall". Why not?

The גְּמָרָא says that we learn this from the height of the אֲרוֹן קדֶשׁ (Holy Ark) which sat in the מִשְַּׁן (Tabernacle) and later in the בִּית הַמִּקְדָּשׁ (Holy Temple).



The Torah tells us that Hashem spoke to משׁׁה רַבֵּינוּ (Moses our teacher) "from on top of the lid", "שמות כה,כב, מעַל הַכַּפּרֶתת, Ex. 25,22), which we now know is 10 טְפָחִים high. The area of Hashem's Presence is 10 טְפָחִים above ground. Below that is a different area - the area of Man. Man's "area" reaches until 10 טְפָחִים off the ground. We see then that an "area" is 10 סוּנָּה high; anything lower is not a real "area." Therefore the walls of be at least this high, otherwise they do not take up a true "area" and would not be true "walls."

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The מְּמָרָא gives us descriptions of some of the other vessels in the מְשְׁן (Tabernacle):

## The שׁׁלְחָן (Table upon which the

 Showbreads lay) has a מִסְגְרֶרת (border) that was one טֶפח high (about 3.5 inches, or 9 cm ). There is a debate whether this border was above the tabletop or beneath it.

The צִיץ (Band) worn on the forehead of the כּהַן גָּדוֹל (High Priest) was like a thin gold plate, two אֶצְבָּעוֹת (fingerbreadths) wide (about 2 inches, or 4.5 cm ). It encircled the 'פֵן from ear to ear. The words "קדֶש לָהּי" (Holy to Hashem) were written on it.

The כְּרוּבִים (Cherubim)'s wings were positioned just above their heads and were 10 טְפָחִים tall.

## Did You Know...

(כְּרוּבִים says, the רַבִּי אַבָּהוֹ atop the Holy Ark got their name from the word "כְּרַבְיָא" meaning, "like a child" since their faces looked like those of children.
