



# Inside the Daf

Educating children to perform מְצְוֹת (commandments) is of paramount importance. That is why the מִּלְבָּה tells us that children who know how to shake a לוּלָב are required to do so.

Here are some מְצְוֹת and privileges for children:

A child who knows how to wrap himself in a garment is obligated

in the ציצית of איצית (fringes)

When a child knows how to take care of תְּפִלִּין (phylacteries) properly, his father should buy him a pair

As soon as a child knows how to speak, his father should teach him the yerse, "תּוֹרָה צִּנָּה לָנוּ מֹשֶׁה מוֹרָשָׁה קְהָלַת יַעֲקֹב", "The Torah that Moses commanded us is the heritage



of the Congregation of Jacob," (דברים לג,ד, Deut. 33,4). He should also teach him the verse of "דברים ו, דברים ו, ד-ט, Deut. 6, 4-9).



A child who is a פֿהֵן and knows how to bless the congregation can be given תְּרוּמָה (tithes).

If a child knows how to slaughter an animal properly, we may eat from what he has slaughtered if an adult stood over him at the time making sure the slaughter was done properly.

Once a child can eat an olive-size piece of roasted meat, we slaughter a Passover sacrifice for him at Passover time.



### Did You Know...

בְּי יְהוּדָה says we can assume that a child knows the difference between something edible and inedible if he throws away a pebble but keeps a nut to eat.

## 2)17 on the Sabbath

The Sages decreed that the מִּצְוָה (commandment) of לוּלָב not be performed on the Sabbath. Why? רָבָּה explains that they were worried someone would carry it out on the Sabbath to an expert to learn the laws of לוּלָב. If one carries it four אַמוֹת (cubits, about 7 ft. or 216 cm) in a public area to take it to the expert, he violates the Sabbath!

בית (Holy Temple), when the first day of the סוכות holiday fell on the Sabbath, people would take their bundle to the Temple Mount on Friday. This way, they would not have to carry the לוּלָב bundle from their homes to the Temple on the Sabbath which is prohibited. The bundles were given to the Temple attendants who would place them on




Shmuely's class had never been so excited. That afternoon, the head of the most important rabbinical court in Israel would be gracing the school with his presence. Of course, several other schools in the area would also be attending.

On the Sabbath, the Temple attendants would toss the bundles to the people. But people started to hit each other in their eagerness to get a לוּלָב bundle. When the Court saw that this was happening they decreed that when סוכות falls out on the Sabbath, the people should perform the מִצְנָה of לוּלֶב in their homes! (Nowadays on the Sabbath we do not perform the מִצְנָה of מִצְנָה

practice of using a לולב in the Temple on the Sabbath."


The crowd stood with perked ears and nodded at the venerable man's words.
