





Inside the Daf

The מִּשְׁנָה taught that during the final seven fasts for rain, a שְׁלִיחַ צִּיבּוּר (prayer leader) is chosen who has children to feed, but no food to feed them (see pg. 51). This way, the prayer leader will pour his heart into the prayers to end the drought. רַבִּי יְהוּדָה lists other traits the should have (see diagram below).



Nineveh's-Repentance

It is probably the greatest success story ever told. The prophet, יוֹנָה (Jonah), is sent by Hashem to order the great city of Nineveh to repent. The people of the city took this order to heart. They fasted, wore sackcloth (a type of clothing woven from goat hair; sackcloth was often worn in times of distress and mourning), and truly repented.



On the last set of fast days for rain, after the public have put ashes on their heads, an elder reminds the people of the Nineveh's repentance.

"Our brothers!" says the elder, "sackcloth and fasting don't cause our prayers to be answered! It is repentance and good deeds that cause prayer to be answered. It is written about the people of Nineveh that Hashem saw their *deeds* that they repented from their bad ways (see ',יננה ג,', Jonah 3,10)."

Even though the people of Nineveh wore sackcloth and fasted, that wasn't what was most important to Hashem. Hashem forgave them because they stopped doing evil.
