



## Inside the Daf

Even though one is not allowed to marry his brother's wife, if one's brother dies without children one is commanded to marry his dead brother's wife. This "marriage" is called יְבוּם.

How much is יבום like marriage?

In the Torah portion of יְבּוּם, the living brother is commanded, "וְּבְּמָה לוֹ לְאִשָּׁה וְיִבְּמָה" "and he should take her to himself for a wife and perform דברים כה,ה) to her" (דברים כה,ה).

Deut. 25,5).

explains, that "וּלְקֵתְהּ" "and he should take her" means that the dead brother's wife becomes completely like the living brother's wife. That means, if the couple want to part ways, they require a גָּט (divorce document) just like any married couple.

יבום explains "וְיִבְּמָה" "and he performs יבּוֹם with her" to mean that the man may perform יבּוֹם even against the woman's will. In such a case, she becomes his full wife. Like with a regular wife, the man will inherit her property if she dies before him. Likewise, if the man is a בֹהֵן he may become טָמֵא by going to her funeral (a בֹהֵן אם not go to the funeral of someone who is not a close relative).







# Mistaken\_Teaching

Believe it or not, teachers make mistakes, too.

The Torah teaches that if the Great סְנַהַדְרִין (Supreme Court) made a mistake and permitted the Jewish people to do a sin, the סֵנְהֵדְרָץ must bring a communal offering called, " פַּר הַעָּלֶם דָּבַר שָׁל צִיבּוּר "a bull for a hidden matter of the community" (see ויקרא ד,יג-כא, Lev. 4,13-21). When this offering is brought, each person who committed the sin that the Court allowed, does not have to bring an offering.

For the סְנְהֵדְרִין to bring this offering, they had to have permitted a sin that is punishable by פַרָת (early death) if done on purpose, and one that requires the sinner to bring a קרבון הַטָּאת (sin-offering) if done by accident. An example of such a sin is permitting forbidden work to be done on the Sabbath.

Also, for this offering to be brought, the majority of the Jewish people had to have listened to the סָנָהֶדְרִין and performed the sin that it allowed.

"Did you help your younger brother study for his test tomorrow?" Eric's dad asked.

"Don't underplay your responsibility to teach properly. That's how much responsibility they had to issue correct rulings. If you are helping someone, take extra care that you are teaching them properly. You wouldn't want them to do something wrong because you were wrong."
