Before a Jewish man marries a non-Jewish woman she must convert to Judaism. Her conversion must be done willingly; the man may not force her to convert.

But there's a case where a man may force a non-Jewish woman to convert. That is the case of a יְפַת תֹאַר which literally means, a "beautiful woman."

A יְפַת תּאַר is an idolatress who is captured from battle by a Jewish soldier. He may bring her home and take her as his wife after she immerses in a מְקֵוֹה (ritual bath) to convert to Judaism, even without her agreement. But not so fast. Before he marries her the Torah says she must shave her head, remove her attractive clothing, sit in her house and cry over her parents for 30 days. רְבִּי עֲקִיבָא says she cries over the idols she may no longer worship once she marries the Jewish soldier. רְבִי שַׁמְעוֹן בֵּן אֵלְעוֹר.

All of these actions are done to make the יפַת תֹאַר unattractive.

Finally, the Torah says she must "make" her fingernails. What does this mean? רַבִּי עֲקִיבָא says she must grow her fingernails long. This makes her more unattractive. רְבִּי אֱלִיעֶיֶר disagrees. Rather, he says, she must remove her fingernails just as she removes her hair.

## The Suffering Of Converts



The גְּמָרָא discusses the causes for the suffering of converts. According to רַבִּי (the son of חֲנַנְיָא (the son of חֲנַנְיָא (the son of מְבַּנְיָא בֹּי (the son of בַּרְי וּבְּי בְּמְלִיאֵל ), if a convert is poor it is because before they converted, they were not careful to keep the commandments that every

non-Jew must keep, the Seven Noahide Laws.

רָבִּי disagrees with רָבִי חֲנֵנְיָא. A non-Jew who converts is like a newborn child, free from sin upon converting. Therefore, Hashem will not punish them on account of sins they did before becoming Jewish.

Instead, רַבִּי says that if a convert is not careful in performing all of the Torah's commandments, the convert will suffer on account of this.

אַבָּא חָנֶן says that converts who suffer do so because they serve Hashem out of fear of punishment and not out of love.

Some explain that converts suffer if they didn't convert as soon as they decided to and delayed "coming under the wings of Hashem's Presence."
